

Air Canada/ Share the Warmth Prize Rules

1) Contest Details

Contest Details To enter the draw for Air Canada tickets requires a minimum donation of \$100 to the "Hope Takes Action" campaign through our online platforms, by cheque, or cash. Your name will be entered in the once, for for each \$100 donated. I.e. If you donated \$1,000, your name will be entered 10 times in the draw. To take part in the contest draw, your donation must have been made via the Share the Warmth donation platforms, by cheque or in cash.

2) Deadline to enter

Deadline to enter Donations must be made from when the Hope Takes Action page was created, until 11:59 PM (EST) on April 30th, 2026.

3) Terms and conditions

Terms and conditions Participants eligible for the draw (donations of \$100 +) will be exported to an Excel file where the index function will be used to randomly determine the winner. The process will be filmed and can be viewed on request. The prize winner will receive: Two economy-class tickets valid for travel to any Air Canada scheduled destination in North America, including Hawaii, Mexico and the Caribbean. Tickets valid for one year after the date of the event and subject to certain conditions, including travel restriction periods.

- The prize draw will take place on **Monday, June 1st 2026 at 1:00 pm (Eastern Time)**. We will contact the winner by telephone and/or e-mail and announce the winner (including their name) on our social media channels on June 4th, 2026.
